REMINDERS

Tree Trimming: All trees must be 15' above the street surface and 8' above sidewalks. Please trim your trees accordingly.

Property Upkeep: Lawns (mowing of grass and weeds) and junk (unlicensed vehicles and debris). Please take the time to make sure your property is in compliance for the above issues.

Camper/ RV/ Trailer Parking: Campers, RVs, and trailers should not be parked more than 48 hours on the street at any location within the city.

Dog Ordinances: Please be advised that the city has ordinances which govern dogs at large, unleashed, and a noise ordinance for barking. The Sioux County Sheriff's Dept. should be notified if you have a dog complaint at 737-2280.

4th of July Fireworks Reminders:



The Code of Ordinances for discharging fireworks within the city reads:

1. No person under the age of 18 shall discharge a DOT 1.4 class consumer firework without parental supervision.
2. Any person shall only discharge a consumer firework device on real property they own or property where consent has been given. Novelties, including snakes, sparklers, or caps, can be discharged on a public place so long as all trash, wrappers, and wires are properly disposed of.
3. Consumer fireworks shall not be discharged by persons showing visible signs of, or determined to be, intoxicated or under the influence of a drug or narcotic.
4. Any person discharging a consumer fireworks device assumes all responsibility for its operation and the consequences thereof. No person shall discharge a consumer fireworks device in a reckless manner or manner likely to cause death, injury, fire, or property damage.
5. No person shall discharge a consumer fireworks device outside the following dates and hours:
 - a. July 1 through July 7 from the hours of 9:00 am until 10:00 pm. Exception: discharge hours are extended to 11:00 pm on July 4 only.
 - b. December 30 through January 1 from the hours of 9:00 am until 10:00 pm. Exception: discharge hours are extended to 12:30 am on January 1.
