Minutes of Monthly Council Meeting

December 12, 2022

Mayor Laryl Koerselman called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

Council members present were Stacie Damstra, Austin Loges, Robin Jungers, Nathan Alexander and Bob Koerselman.

Others present were Gary Kurth, Brent Steven, and city employee Tami Kamies.

Brent presented to the council the individuals that the Boyden Ambulance voted in as ambulance director and assistant ambulance director. Brent Steven as ambulance director and Chris Diekevers as assistant ambulance director. B. Koerselman made a motion to approve the individuals as presented. Loges supported. Motion carried 5-0.

Gary Kurth with DGR came to discuss with council how they would like to proceed with the assessments on the Prairie Street project. Council reviewed and asked Gary Kurth to present another option for the street to the council. Council will table this discussion to a later date after all data is received.

Maintenance Report – We were able to purchase a different sander from the county. We will try to come up with a replacement schedule for equipment that the city has. This will allow for us to budget and update equipment as it is felt necessary.

Consent Agenda -Jungers made a motion for approval of the bills in the amount of \$96,188.34, the November financials, the November 14 minutes, and the building permit for Alan Cox. B. Koerselman supported. Motion carried 5-0.

A discussion was had about moving forward with the Park Concept Plan for Centennial Park. We will hold off on proceeding with these park plans until we know if the development of the property of the west ball diamond will be moving forward.

Damstra made a motion to approve Resolution 2022-16 authorizing the disposal of municipally owned real estate. Loges supported. Motion was carried 5-0.

A discussion was had regarding the water and sewer rates. Jungers made a motion that we will impose a minimum of a 2% increase every year on the water and sewer rates, but will revisit and review the rates on a yearly basis. There will be a 2% increase to water and sewer rates this year. Damstra supported. Motion carried 5-0.

Council reviewed employee wages for the city employees. The library board will determine the wages for the library employees. Council will approve by Resolution all wage adjustments at the January meeting.

With no further discussion B. Koerselman made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Damstra support. Motion carried 5-0. Meeting was adjourned 8:09 p.m.
